The Greatest Letter Ever No Condemnation Romans 8:1-2

Introduction: Heading To The High Country

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. (Romans 8:1-2)

What Is Condemnation?

Note: It's easy to describe condemnation by how you feel: guilty, fearful, and rejected.

How Does God Respond To Me When I Sin?

1st Response: God doesn't reject me when I sin

- God's love is unconditional
- Our acceptance isn't based on performance
- Our acceptance is based on our position in Christ

2nd Response: God isn't angry with me when I'm inconsistent

Question: How can it be that God doesn't become angry with us?

- God knows how we are made (Psalm 103:13-14)
- Jesus understands because He is one of us (Hebrews 4:15-16)

3rd Response: God doesn't punish me when I sin

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. (1 Peter 3:18)

He does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. (Psalm 103:10-12)

What Does Happen When A Christian Sins?

1st Result: Sin brings conviction from God (John 16:8)

2nd Result: Sin hurts people around us (1 Chronicles 21)

- 3rd Result: Sins hurts us and destroys our happiness (Galatians 6:7-8)
- 4th Result: Sin breaks fellowship with God (1 John 1:6-7)
- 5th Result: Sin limits your usefulness to God (John 15:4)
- 6th Result: Sin brings loving discipline from God (Hebrews 12:5-7)
- 7th Result: Sin results in a loss of rewards in heaven (2 John 8; 1 Corinthians 3:14-15)

What Should a Christian Who Sins Do?

1st Insight: Remember you have an advocate 1 John 2:1-2)

My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world. (1 John 2:1-2)

2nd Insight: Confess your sin (1 John 1:9)

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)

3rd Insight: Accept Forgiveness and forgive yourself (1 John 3:19-20)

This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence: If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. (1 John 3:19-20)
